ORGANIZATION OF MASA MASID Regional Technical Working Group (RTWG)

In order to fully implement the activities of the MASA MASID Program, the DILG spearheaded the organization of a TWG composed of partners from the different regional government agencies in its Organizational Meeting. Thru the TWG, a Joint Memorandum Circular (DILG-DOH-DSWD) was crafted which provided for guidelines in program implementation in terms of duties and responsibilities of stakeholders. The TWG also provided critical inputs in the development and implementation of the Community Based Rehabilitation Program (CBRP), one of the major deliverables under the MASA MASID Program.

As part of the over-all implementation effort of the Program, the office partnered with the DOJ-Parole and Probation Administration (PPA) for the conduct of Training of Trainors (ToT) for the Community Rehabilitation Networks under the Community as One in the Rehabilitation of Drug Surrenderers (CORD) Project. The ToT was conducted in the following schedules:

The activity was facilitated by the Parole and Probation Administration headed by Regional Director Benita L. Maramag, DPA Audiovisual presentations, workshops and structured learning exercises such as dyad, triad and static group discussions were employed by the facilitators in the activity. Aside from the objective of educating stakeholders and partners of the necessary knowledge and skills in dealing with drug surrenderers at the community level, the facilitators aimed to allow the participants to fully understand the situation of drug Surrenderers by placing themselves on the surrender's shoes.

REGIONAL INTER-AGENCY COMMITTEE ON ANTI-ILLEGA L DRUGS (ICAD)

Executive Order No. 15 dated March 7, 2017 provided for the creation of ICAD. Under EO 15, the following agencies are tasked to lead their respective cluster: Enforcement - PDEA; Justice — DOJ; Advocacy — DILG and Rehabilitation — DOH.

The Organizational Meeting of the Regional ICAD was held on October 9, 2017 at DILG Conference Hall, attended by 32 participants from PDEA, MIG-2 ISAFP, PAO, DSWD, BJMP, DepEd, AFP, DTI, PNP, TESDA, DOJ-PPA, DOJ-NPS, NBI, DOH, DOH-DATRC, DOLE.

With EO 15, the main focus of DILG on MASA MASID is re-directed to Advocacy and Information Gathering and Reporting. One of the major thrust in the advocacy campaigns against illegal drugs is the strengthening of M/C/BADACs.

Two (2) barangays in Burgos, Isabela namely Cullalabo del Sur and Dalig have been identified as pilot areas for BADAC strengthening. With the assistance of PDEA and PNP, an orientation was conducted in said barangays last July 22-23, 2017.

Strengthening of M/C/BADAC was also the highlight of the MASA MASID Planning Conference held on September 19-20 at Crown Pavillion. The activity was attended by PDs, Focal Persons, Cluster Officers, Regional and Community Facilitators. Among the outputs during the activity included the formulation of Provincial Action Plans on the major deliverables of the Program.

A Regional Roll-Out for Strengthening of BADACs was conducted on November 27-28, 2017 at Villablanca Hotel, Tuguegarao City. The activity was attended by Cluster Officers, Focal Persons, selected Field Officers, Regional and Community Facilitators. Partners from PDEA and PNP were tapped to discuss salient provisions of laws and issuances on illegal drugs, citizens' arrest, among others.



REGIONAL AND COMMUNITY FACILITATORS

Part of the implementation strategy is the hiring/engagement of personnel to oversee and monitor the implementation of the activities and deliverables of the Program. For this purpose, I Regional Facilitator and 25 Community Facilitators (Batanes-2; Cagayan-8; Isabela-10; Nueva Vizcaya-4; Quirino-2).

REGIONAL TRAINING ROLL-OUT ON FEEDBACK MECHANISM

The Regional Training Roll-out on MASA MASID Feedback Mechanism was conducted in December 19-20, 2017, at 3k Hotel, Santiago City. The participants were C/MLGOOs as Chairpersons of the MASA MASID Technical Working Group and all Regional and Community Facilitators who are front liners of the project. The main objective of the activity was to equip said Field Officers with the appropriate technical skills to effectively perform their roles especially in data gathering and monitoring aspects of the project.

There were 135 participants during the roll-out composed of City and Municipal Local Government Operations Officers, Provincial Directors, Cluster Officers, Program Managers, MASA MASID Focal Persons, MASA MASID Regional and Community Facilitators. Resource Speakers were from the Philippine National Police (PNP) RO2.

DILG RO2 RD Jonathan Paul M. Leusen, Jr. ensured the successful conduct of the activity thru the Local Government Monitoring and Evaluation Division (LGMED).







NATIONAL TRAINING OF TRAINERS

As part of strengthening the PLEB, a Training of Trainers for Regional and Provincial Focal Persons was held last September 4-8, 2017 at Linden Suites, Pasig City.

One of the outputs during the activity was an Action Plan for the conduct of training for all PLEBs which will commence in November.



PROVINCIAL ROLL-OUT

Dubbed as Project POLICE: PLEBs Orientation-Seminar on Legal Procedures Instilling Community Participation for Empowerment, DILG RO2 in collaboration with the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) Region 2 successfully conducted the Regional Training Roll-Out for the Capacity Enhancement of the People's Law Enforcement Boards (PLEB). Conducted in 11 schools with a duration of 2 days per school, the activity was spearheaded by the Local Government Monitoring and Evaluation Division (LGMED) under the supervision of its Division Chief Digna R. Herrera.

The training was conducted to orient and capacitate the PLEB members and other stakeholders on basic PLEB concepts such as legal basis, composition, functions and powers, and rules of procedures. It also served as an avenue to raise and clarify issues and concerns on PLEB. A total of 527 participants composed of City/Municipal Local Government Operations Officers, PLEB Chairmen, members, secretariat and other DLLG technical staff actively took part in the series of trainings.



A Briefing Conference and Regional Audit Team Reorganizational Meeting was conducted on June 16, 2017 attended by partners from NEDA, DSWD, DepEd and CFLGA PFPs.

The Regional Assessment Team headed by DILG and composed of representatives from DSWD, DepEd, NEDA, and DOH, conducted its Table Validation last August 15, 2017.



The Provincial Stakeholder's Forum was conducted aimed to achieve the following:



The Regional Project Management Office (RPMO) recently conducted the Orientation-Workshop on the new PCF Website and Development of the PCF compendium attended by the Regional and Provincial PCF Focal Persons, ITO and RIO at the Conference Hall, DILG Regional Office 02, Tuguegarao City on October 18, 2017. The activity aimed to orient the participants of the features of the new website and identify issues and concerns during the actual use of the website. ADM-FUNDED ACCESS ROADS TO IMPROVE ACCESSIBILITY IN LUNA, ISABELA

Better road accessibility is seen to flourish in Luna, Isabela these coming days.

This is made possible through the inauguration of three (3) Local Access Roads funded under the 2017 Assistance to Disadvantaged Municipalities (ADM) program of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) on December 04, 2017.

Luna, Isabela is one of the municipalities granted with the first batch of ADM recipients in the Region.

The grant was utilized by the municipal government in paving roads that connect the 3 barangays to the main thoroughfares in the municipality.

A total of Php14,900,000.00 comprises the total cost of the concreting of the local access roads in 3 barangays of Luna, Isabela.

The concreting of road in Barangay Centro I covering the seven (7) streets entails a total of 729 linear meters with a total cost of Php7,290,000.00.

A total of Php3,610,000.00 covered the concreting of 361 linear meter-road in Purok 7, Barangay Lalog 1.

Meanwhile, a total of Php4,000,000.00 entailed the concreting of 400 linear meter-road in Purok 5, Barangay Mambabanga connecting the National Highway to the Luna General Comprehensive High School (LGCHS).

Municipal Mayor Hon. Jaime N. Atayde said that the project will ease transportation among the barangay residents as well as the residents of neighboring barangays.


He also added that the project will enable better economic activities in the municipality.

REGIONAL ORIENTATION

Conducted in three (3) clusters: May 10, 2017 at 3K Hotel, Santiago City, Isabela (combined: Isabela and Nueva Vizcaya), May 12, 2017 at Crown Pavilion, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (combined: Cagayan and Quirino) and simultaneously on the same date (May 12, 2017) in Basco, Batanes for the island province of Batanes. Discussions during the Orientation were the following: SGLG context; Overview of the 2017 SGLG; SGLG requirements across the seven (7) focus areas; implementation strategies, responsibilities, and deployment plan.



All 5 provinces, 4 cities, and 89 municipalities were assessed by the Assessment Teams organized for the purpose. The Regional Office, thru the Assistant Regional Director as RAT Leader assessed the provinces and cities. Municipalities were assessed by the respective Teams in the provincial level thru cross-posting scheme. On the one hand, a special team from the Regional Office took charge in the assessment of the 6 municipalities of Batanes. The assessment ran from May 14-June 16, 2017.

PROVINCIAL, REGIONAL AND NATIONAL CALIBRATION AND VALIDATION

The activity was conducted on July 10-14, 2017 at 3K Hotel, Santiago City. A total of 58 LGUs were recommended for national validation and calibration as follows: Batanes — 2; Cagayan — 12; Isabela — 27; Nueva Vizcaya — 12; and Quirino — 5.

As a result of the National Calibration and Validation held on August 1-4, 2017 at Sulo Hotel, 37 LGUs in Region 02 were recommended for national validation and assessment.

CROSS-POSTING

The National Validation and Assessment, as in the previous years, was done thru cross-posting by DILG Regional Offices. For LGUs in Region 02, assessment was done by DILG Region 1. On the one hand, DILG Region 02 assessed LGUs in the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR).

37 LGUs (Batanes — 2; Cagayan — 7; Isabela — 17; Nueva Vizcaya — 8; Quirino — 3) were assessed by DILG Region I headed by RD James Fadrilan along with Provincial Directors, CLGOOs, Regional Focal Person, and other technical staff. The assessment was made from August 22 — September 1, 2017.

NATIONAL VALIDATION AND INDORSEMENT BY THE NATIONAL

The last stage for the SGLG is the final review and confirmation by the NQC of the LGUs submitted by cross-posting Region. As a result of its meeting last September 27-30, 2017, 29 LGUs from Region 02 have been recommended as 2017 SGLG passers: Batanes — 1; Cagayan — 6; Isabela — 16; Nueva Vizcaya — 3; and Quirino - 3.



CONDUCT OF TRAINING ON DEVELOPING SUSTAINABLE LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (LED) STRATEGIES

Developing Sustainable Local Economic Development (LED) Strategies was created to ensure understanding of the local economic structure, the investment needs and the attributes that may influence investments and economic growth in the local level.

To ensure attainment of its objectives, DILG-Region 02 conducted a series of meetings and orientation with representatives of State Universities and Colleges, Provincial Governments Cagayan, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya and Quirino and concerned national government agencies within the month of July 2017. An interfacing cum orientation on LED with concerned LGU functionaries of the Province of Batanes and representatives from Batanes State University was conducted on September 14, 2017.

Moving forward in its implementation, the Training/Roll-out on Developing Sustainable LED Strategies was conducted at Crown Hotel and Restaurant, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan on November 15-17, 2017. The training was participated bty representatives and functionaries of the five provinces of the region.

The activity aimed to provide the participants with the knowledge and skills necessary in crafting strategies for local economic development.



MONITORING AND EVALUATION OF EXISTING PPP PROJECTS IN THE REGION



The Public-Private Partnership for People Initiative for Local Governments (LGU P4) Program which aims to hasten economic development, improve the quality of public assets and the efficiency of public services, and encourage innovation to make lives of every Filipino better and easier. As part of the Department's commitment to promote local economic development, a monitoring and evaluation of the existing P4 projects in the region particularly in Cauayan City, Isabela and Bayombong, Nueva Vizcaya was conducted on October 4-6, 2017. The monitoring and evaluation was primarily conducted to identify the completion rate and evaluate the progress of the projects as well as to gather data on the implementation process of the projects.

CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT ON THE PREPARATION OF FEASIBILITY STUDY/PROJECT PROPOSAL: FS 101

One of the most important component of implementing a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) engagement is the preparation and formulation of project proposal and feasibility study. Feasibility study is the assessment of the viability of an idea with emphasis on the market, social/economic/environmental, technical, financial, and organizational/administrative aspect. Feasibility study tests the project's sustainability and viability. It serves as a solid foundation in applying business ideas on project conceptualization, development and implementation.

To sustain efforts and interventions to the target LGUs, a Training on the Preparation of Feasibility Study was conducted on November 8-10, 2017 at Hotel Carmelita, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan to enhance the skills and knowledge of LGU planners to include the City/Municipal Engineer, City/Municipal Planning and Local Development Coordinator, Local Economic and Investment Promotions Officer and City/Municipal Accountant in identifying the opportunities and threats of a PPP project from conceptualization to implementation up to monitoring phase.

Resource speakers are composed of researchers and professors from Cagayan State University. The output of the activity are the draft feasibility study of the participating LGUs prepared during the workshop.



The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)-Isabela recognized top performing LGUs in the implementation of the Assistance to Disadvantaged Municipalities (ADM) program through Assistance to Disadvantaged Municipalities Incentives and Recognition of Exemplars (ADMIRE).

LGUs awarded include Benito Soliven, Cabatuan, Luna, Mallig, Naguilian, Ramon, Roxas and San Mariano. These LGUs were given plaque of recognition and cash incentives.

DILG-Isabela Provincial Director Elpidio A. Durwin hoped that the recognition given may inspire the awarded LGUs and other LGUs to perform better in the implementation of locally-funded projects.

Also, he encouraged the LGUs to sustain or improve their performance in pursuit of meaningful local governance.

ADMIRE is an incentive and awards program initiated by DILG-Isabela which seeks to give recognition to top performing municipalities in the implementation of 2017 ADM projects.

The search covered February to November 2017, commencing from the submission of LGUs of documentary requirements for ADM projects until the conduct of final inspection of projects.

The criteria used in determining the awardees entail physical accomplishment of the project (20%), submission of liquidation report (20%), observance of the process in the implementation of the project (20%), functionality of the Local Development Council (LDC) with Civil Society Organization (CSO) Membership (15%) and quality and functionality of project (25%).

Meanwhile, regional nominees for the 2014-2016 Best Bottom-Up Budgeting (BuB) Implementers were also awarded with plaque and cash incentives.

These LGUs include Angadanan, Cabatuan, Jones, San Guillermo and San Manuel.



DILG-Isabela revs disaster preparedness thru IT

Natural or human-induced disasters happen everywhere. The past occurrences of disasters brought havoc to all facets of life. The damages that wreaked by disasters underscore the need for Local Government Units to prepare measures attuned in addressing the possible aftermath of disasters.

To beef up disaster preparedness of LGUs in the Province, Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) — Isabela conducted a DRRM-CCA Hazard Mapping Training Workshop cum Climate and Disaster Risk Assessment (CDRA) Cliniquing. DILG-Isabela tapped the expertise of Local Resource Institutes (LRIs) and Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) Focal Persons in conducting a crash course on hazard mapping through mapping tool or software called Quantum Geographical Information System (QGIS).

The activity was conducted in two schools for selected LGUs in the Province, Local Planning and Development Coordinators, Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officers and Information Technology personnel actively participated in the undertaking. Outputs of the participants include Digital Hazard Maps and completed CDRA tables which aid in mainstreaming DRR-CCA in socio-economic profiles of LGUs to be incorporated in their different local development plans.

For Isabela, disaster preparedness became a way of life for no one can tell how tragic next disasters can be.


