DILG Region 02 through the Local Government Monitoring and Evaluation Division (LGMED) has accomplished the following:

Regional Technical Working Group Meeting

The RTWG meeting was held last August 14, 2017 attended by partners from Philippine Army, PDEA, PNP, NBI, DOH, DOJ-PPA, BJMP, DSWD, PIA, TESDA, DTI, DENR, CHED.

One of the important discussions during the meeting was the Executive Order creating the ICAD and Region 02's accomplishments in MASA MASID implementation. One of the issues raised was on the assessment and screening of surrenders, which DOH is requested to look into the matter. It was also during this time that the CBRP Program was turned over to DOH which is now the lead agency. Plaques of Appreciation were also awarded to BJMP and DOJ-PPA for their support to DILG in the implementation of the CBRP.

Regional and Community Facilitators

Part of the Program Guidelines is the hiring of Regional and Community Facilitators.

## ■ Planning Conference and Orientation

One of the outputs during the activity was an Action Plan for the conduct of training for all PLEBs which will commence in November.


I. 3-Day In-House Training-Workshop On The Formulation Of Detailed Engineering Design (DED) Cum MOA Signing

DILG Region 02 thru the Regional Project Management Office


(RPMO) initiated the conduct of a training on the formulation of DED at Zen Hotel, Santiago City on July 25-27, 2017.

# ACCOUNTABLE, TRANSPARENT, PARTICIPATIVE AND EFFECTIVE GOVERNANCE

#### SEAL OF GOOD LOCAL GOVERNANCE (SGLG)

The LGMED has conducted the following activities in determining exemplar LGUs:

Provincial, Regional and National Calibration and Validation

The activity was conducted on July 10-14, 2017 at 3K Hotel, Santiago City. A total of 58 LGUs were recommended for national validation and calibration as follows: Batanes – 2; Cagayan – 12; Isabela – 27; Nueva Vizcaya – 12; and Quirino – 5.

As a result of the National Calibration and Validation held on August 1-4, 2017 at Sulo Hotel, 37 LGUs in Region 02 were recommended for national validation and assessment.

## □ Cross-Posting

The National Validation and Assessment, as in the previous years, was done thru cross-posting by DILG Regional Offices. For LGUs in Region 02, assessment was done by DILG Region 1. On the one hand, DILG Region 02 assessed LGUs in the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR).

37 LGUs (Batanes – 2; Cagayan – 7; Isabela – 17; Nueva Vizcaya – 8; Quirino – 3) were assessed by DILG Region 1 headed by RD James Fadrilan along with Provincial Directors, CLGOOs, Regional Focal Person, and other technical staff. The assessment was made from August 22 – September 1, 2017.

□ National Validation and Indorsement by the National Quality Committee

The last stage for the SGLG is the final review and confirmation by the NQC of the LGUs submitted by cross-posting Region. As a result of its meeting last September 27-30, 2017, 29 LGUs from Region 02 have been recommended as 2017 SGLG passers: Batanes – 1; Cagayan – 6; Isabela – 16; Nueva Vizcaya – 3; and Quirino - 3.

#### CITIZENS SATISFACTION INDEX SYSTEM (CSIS)

In preparation for the 2017 CSIS Implementation, a training for Local Resource Institutes was held last June 27-29, 2017. This was attended by Cagayan State University (CSU) and Isabela State University (ISU), together with DILG technical staff. For 2017, two (2) municipalities in included in the target LGUs.

Orientation for Lallo and Echague was held on July 19 and 20, 2017, respectively. A Memorandum of Agreement was signed among DILG, the target municipalities, and the partner-LRIs.

To date, CSU and ISU are now in the process of report writing which will be submitted to Regional Office for review by 2<sup>nd</sup> week of October. The Report will be submitted to BLGS before end of October. Utilization Conference is scheduled in November.

#### LGU INCENTIVES AND AWARDS (LGUIA)

## □ Planning Conference

To map out activities and timelines, a Planning Conference was conducted last July 20, 2017 attended and participated in by Cluster Officers, Focal Persons, and other technical staff. Presentation of 2017 Guidelines, review and enhancement of evaluation tools were also made during the activity.

For this year's implementation of the Program and as part of its continuous improvement, the Search for Most Outstanding City and Municipal Peace and Order Council (C, MPOC) is now included.

## ■ Regional Evaluation

The Regional Evaluation commenced  $2^{nd}$  week of September and will run until  $2^{nd}$  week of October. Partner agencies namely, PNP, NAPOLCOM, PDEA, BJMP, PFP, PIA, DSWD, DOJ, RTC, comprised the Evaluation Team.

## **FULL DISCLOSURE POLICY (FDP)**

Continuous monitoring of FDP compliance both in conspicuous places and portal is conducted thru the Provincial Offices. For 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter level of compliance, only the municipality of Sto. Tomas is not fully compliant.

FDP compliance remains a key indicator of the SGLG.

# CONDUCT OF THE ROLL-OUT TRAINING ON RESOURCE MOBILIZATION AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND ANALYSIS

The Roll-out Training on Resource Mobilization and Financial Management Analysis was conducted on July 24-26, 2017 at Villa Blanca Hotel, Ugac Norte, Tuguegarao City. A total of twenty-eight (28) participants from the 5 provinces of the region joined the activity.

With the present administration's thrust to expedite socio-economic development, it is a must to improve revenue generation and financial management of LGUs especially the Provincial Governments. Relative to this, it is necessary to capacitate the major actors of local development and these actors and actresses are the Planning Officers, Budget Officers, Assessors, Treasurers and Members of the Sanggunian. Thus, the conduct of the Roll-out Training on Resource Mobilization and Financial Analysis is essential and timely.

# REGIONAL WORKSHOP ON NATIONAL/REGIONAL STRATEGIC PRIORITIES AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDG) ALIGNMENT

In line with country's commitment in the attainment of the Sustainable Development Goals, the Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2017-2022 has been approved and currently adopted. The PDP, taking off from the Administration's 0+10 Point Socio-Economic Agenda and anchored on the national long-term vision, Ambisyon 2040, aims to lay a stronger foundation for inclusive growth, a high-trust and resilient society, and a globally-competitive knowledge economy.

With the Duterte Administration's thrust and aspiration of turning the Ambisyon 2040 into reality and create a "Matatag, Maginhawa, at Panatag na Bayan", the DILG together with NEDA conducted the Regional Workshop on National/Regional Strategic Priorities and Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Alignment on August 10-11, 2017 at Pulsar Hotel, Tuguegarao City. This 2-day activity intends to facilitate alignment of local level PPAs to the SDGs and national and regional priorities for more responsive local investment programs and at the same time strengthening the statutory local development process. A total of ninety (90) participants joined in the activity particularly the members of the Provincial Development Council-Executive Committee as well as DILG Provincial and Regional CDP, DRR and SDG Focal Persons.

Further, to harmonize all resources and efforts towards aligning all developmental goals and thrusts from the national to the local levels and come up with an alliance building output, the provinces also conducted a Provincial Strategic Direction Setting Conference cum Alliance Building Workshop. After the Provincial Direction Setting, they also conducted Participatory Project Prioritization Conference Workshop at the Municipal Level. DILG Regional Office monitored and provided necessary technical assistance in the conduct of the said activities. DBM, OCD, PSA, PNP, DA, DOH, DENR, NICA and other Regional Line Agencies also took part in the successful conduct of the activity.

## CONDUCT OF TRAINING ON BUSINESS PLANNING

With the objective of helping LGUs in identifying critical business opportunities available in the locality and maximize its resources in pushing toward economic activities at the local level, DILG Region 02 conducted training on Business Planning on July 12-14, 2017 at Villa Blanca Hotel, Tuguegarao City.

The Local Government Units of Piat, Cagayan, Nagtipunan, Quirino, Cabatuan, Isabela and Sta. Fe, Nueva Vizcaya participated in the training. The activity aims to capacitate LGUs in the formulation of Business Plan and to help investors identify investment priority areas that will create a wealth of investments and jobs in the locality.

# ORIENTATION ON LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (LED) AND PRESENTATION OF MOA

To help the LGUs in achieving sustainable local economic development, series of interventions and trainings are being conducted by the Department. One of these activities is the conduct of Orientation on Local Economic Development.

The orientation was participated by LEIPOs of the 5 provinces in the region and representatives from the Quirino State University and Nueva Vizcaya State University on July 27, 2017 at the DILG Cagayan Provincial Office. In the same day, the draft Memorandum of Agreement was presented to the group for critiquing and input before it will be signed by the Governors and all concerned officials.

REGIONAL CONSULTATION CUM BUSINESS **MATCHING:** LINKING THE DEMANDS FOR LOCAL DEVELOPMENT BETWEEN LGUS AND PRIVATE/BUSINESS SECTOR THROUGH PUBLIC-PRIVATE **PARTNERSHIP** FOR THE PEOPLE INITIATIVE FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENTS (LGU P4)

As a follow through activity after the conduct of Regional Orientation on P4, a Regional Consultation cum Business Matching was conducted on September 4-5, 2017 at Villablanca Hotel, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan to link and meet the needs and demands between LGUs and Private/Business Sector in the development of local economy through Public-Private Partnership. WORKSHOP ON POPULATING PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP FOR THE PEOPLE INITIATIVE FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENTS (LGU P4) PORTAL/DATABASE FOR LGUS AND PRIVATE/BUSINESS SECTOR

With the growing number of projects implemented through PPP, a database is needed to view and see the status of these projects and its impact to the lives of the people or community. With this, an LGU P4 Portal or Database was developed to collect and integrate this information into one database or system that links to the website of the Department.

The LGU P4 portal facilitate the profiling of project details commenced by both the LGU and Private/Business Sector. It aims to promote local economic development and ensure transparency in project implementation. It also aims to bring information together from diverse sources in a uniform way. The data will help other LGUs to replicate the best practices or successful PPP engagement.

With the above, a Workshop on Populating on LGU P4 Portal or Database was conducted on September 6-7, 2017 at Villablanca Hotel, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan to train the Local Governments as well as the Private/Business Sector on the use of the portal and to encode their existing successful engagement with the Private/Business Sector as well as their proposed PPP projects. The training intends to help the Department collate and consolidate all the information to measure a successful PPP arrangement and engagement.
